To be eligible for District events a Horse or Pony must be owned by someone living in the District and ridden by the owner or a member of the owner's family. District refers to the area between the Rangitata and South Ashburton (including Boyers Stream) Rivers, between the hills and the railway line, but excluding that part of Tinwald within the town boundary. 4. All Horses and Ponies entered in height classes must carry a current height certificate either (a) Life Certificate; (b) R A S Annual Certificate; (c) Mayfield A & P Association Certificate which can be obtained from the measuring steward on the grounds between 7.30 am and 8.30 am. Horse / Pony Height Certificates and Performance Cards must be carried. Failure to do so will result in elimination. 5.
